



- I really appreciated time given for checking in, in person writing assignments and small group work.
- "This class had an unusual format. I found it a bit difficult to figure out what was needed, as instructions were loose. That said, because the instructor was so easy-going, it seemed as if anything we did would be okay. I admit that oddly this lead to some feeling of unease, and then I would just relax into it. While that probably says more about me and my personal need for structure and clarity. Also, the assignments almost always seemed to be on the lite-side, and then every time I would be surprised at how deep they took me!
- One request that I have is that the assignments be listed in the assignments tab, rather than the lessons tab. Or
  maybe in addition to the lessons tab. It would be easier to locate them that way at a glance and more efficient for
  searching!"
- The content was spot on for the course and it was easily digestible and understood. It's an on-going effort to work on some of the content but I feel supported by the instructor and fellow students.
- The course could benefit from a bit more structure/organization.

- The reflective essays I found to be very therapeutic. I felt as if I was being lead down a path of healing that helped me to better articulate what I was feeling about a particular experience, or how I connected to the course material. This gave me opportunities to go deeper and further investigate my and understand what I learned as a take away in a more personally connected way. I was able to make more connection between what we were being taught and apply to how I relate that information to myself and the world around me.



FACULTY (Yangsi Rinpoche)



- Prior to this class, I had a regular meditation practice. I was completely blown away by how much deeper and poignant the materials took me in my own practice. I'm grateful for the guidance.
- I found the sitting time too much for myself, especially in the beginning. I liked Venerable Khadro's format of 4 sessions with breaks in between. But I think it's also good to have long sessions, just to push the limits. Also, I found sources saying one does not necessarily have to cultivate shamatha first. It is possible to develop insight first, or insight and calm abiding in conjunction. It seemed like the only mentioned path was shamatha first, so maybe mentioning these other 2 ways would benefit students.
- It is difficult to complete the last week of this term when weekly assignments, class, and finals are all due the same week. Is it possible to have a "dead week" or a week just for finals?
- Instruction along with discussion boards worked well. The readings were a good fit. The rinpoche masterfully

- unpacked the nuances of the practices and words used to describe the territory.
- Zoom meditation can be challenging in some ways but it is certainly better than no instruction at all.
- Closer integration/referencing of the readings and course material or reframing of those readings as supplementary texts rather than required reading. The flow and function of the class over Zoom was excellent and I was very impressed with that element. Rinpoche and David were both outstanding all the way through!
- "The readings and study for philosophy 301 overlap with this class and so this pertains more to PhI, but I would find it helpful to have discussions timed to the assigned readings. Often when I was reading an assignment, I was filled with questions, and there was no opportunity to address these as they arose. A free forum (as is possible in Facebook groups) among students and instructor/aide might be a way to do this, so discussions could arise organically from students' inquiries.
- The discussion prompts for this class were excellent for addressing what is emerging in our meditation practice and for drawing our attention to areas we may not have contemplated on our own!"
- The question 6 is my own problem since I didn't do any of the assignments so I cannot say one way or the other. But if I've had, I think it probably will help.

- Everyone involved (Rinpoche and David) were very adept and extremely professional. Getting the opportunity to listen and learn from both of them was very humbling and something I will keep inside and referring to for many years.
- David was great. I really like the discussion questions he posed and also how consistent and timely he was in his






- Really appreciate the depth of this course. It is a lot of material to dive into but it seems necessary to develop a strong foundation for further study.



- Cutting Through Appearances is a very helpful and clear book, yet it was not used until requested by students. I would highly suggest using this text from the get go because of Jeffery Hopkin's incredibly clear translation. Also, perhaps taking more time to go more thoroughly through one text rather than just getting a glimpse at many would be more clear and helpful for the students.
- The course content is very profound but Rinpoche helped explain everything so well, it was understandable.
- I appreciated the variety of the materials presented in class. There were many ways to approach Madhyamaka Philosophy.
- "A few of the readings were ""over my head"" where I felt lost. Once we were given context in class, they started to make more sense. If I might humbly suggest that Shantideva's chapter 9, in the Dalai Lama book on Wisdom might be looked at as a potential resource in the future?
- Zoom is an imperfect medium and we made it work! I would like to suggest the use of visuals to assist in our

- learning -- i.e. when the five logical systems were presented, a visual would have been helpful.
- The presentation of the interpretation of the poem ""Recognizing My Mother"" was confusing. I wonder if we might have been introduced to these ideas in a more compressed way, perhaps over 1-2 classes.

- Thank-you to Rinpoche and Sunitha! The study group we started the last 3 weeks was extremely helpful, thank-you Sunitha!"



#### **FACULTY** (Leigh Miller)



- So much content! It was all very interesting and important, so I don't know what should be removed, but it was an awful lot. This course could probably be spread out over many semesters, but of course there is only so much time.
- I appreciated the range of different engaged Buddhist leaders that we covered. It gave me a chance to delve into each of them deeper. A request would be to have rubric earlier.
- I think that presenting 'woke' ideologies in a context that places them on the 'correct' side of social justice can be unfair with regards to the potential for legitimate conversation. While the course did not steer us towards any particular conclusion, I think that institutions, especially liberal institutions, need to be mindful about what is presented as foundational or fundamental.
- Perhaps less content and more chance to go deeper and discuss issues of particular interest to students. The content was fascinating and rich but sometimes I felt i was not able to fully explore, digest, dialogue in small groups or have richly layered large group discussions that would have ushered in more integration of content.
- "This was an excellent course thank-you!
- My suggestion would be to provide a packet of the readings for students -- for a fee. A number of the hand-outs

were unreadable either from the screen (i.e. sideways, light print, edges cut off) or when printed off.

- Very helpful feedback was offered for the assignment on our volunteerism.
- Difficult to prioritize the time, as there is so much wonderful content to cover! In the future, feel free to focus on fewer powerful engaged Buddhists so that each can be covered more thoroughly.
- Generally, a deductive approach was used, and this is effective for the way my brain works. The presentation on Aung San Suu Kyi was more of an inductive approach, from parts to whole, more challenging to get my head around it.
- So appreciate the great efforts you made, Leigh, and how conscientious you are."
- It felt overwhelming while we were going through it. If it were up to me, I would probably slow it down and spend two weeks on every topic/person. I am fan of deepening and felt we were only able to skim the surface. So my request would be to slow it down and cover half as much material and deepen into it. I also think this would allow for more practice. I want this topic to be from the heart practice--and due to speed--it (3/4 of the time) felt very heady. So, maybe one week of intellectual learning, and a second week of deepening in practice into that topic/person. I also have a request, that the group agreements be reviewed for 2-3 weeks. It felt that we moved away from them--and they were not reviewed until midterm time.
- The question I am pondering has to do with the Buddhist institutions. Very few of the people we studied were aligned with Buddhist institutions; mostly, they were activists who happened to be Buddhist and brought that lens to their work. When I think of how Buddhist institutions actually treat people who have different ideas, or who speak up about injustice, it is quite disheartening. I really liked Stephanie Kaza's differentiation between "Big B" Buddhism and "small b" buddhism. The conclusion I am coming to is that the institution is not capable of real engaged Buddhism and it is really up to the individuals to practice small b Buddhism. It is very important for me to believe that the institution has its ethics in the right place and there is a little bit of cynicism in my mind about Buddhist institutions (thinking about FPMT) talking about engaged Buddhism when I know that they also don't strongly condemn sexual assault and violence against women. I think it is very hard for an organization to take the position that it has some answers for injustice when the back end of the organization is committing injustice.
- Course content from a resources standpoint was amazing if not overflowing. Time to integrate these, for example, starting the praxis assignment early would be really helpful. Also, start by sharing in small group of initial personal engaged Buddhist assessment. Seemed that we left the course not really knowing how students were engaged except in one discussion board.

- Seemed to favor the males in the class.
- Leigh knows so much about so many things! I'm amazed at how well she is able to teach so many different classes. All of us at Maitripa are lucky to have her.



#### FACULTY (LaShelle Lowe-Charde)



- "It seemed that a limiting factor in this class was the degree of experience students brought to their own self-empathy. This would appear to be a pre-requisite to giving empathy effectively to others, and for authentic and vulnerable participation in class. Under the circumstances, providing a foundation for this part of the work in the beginning of the term would help put everyone in place together. The weekly Feelings and Needs assignment was terrific. I would suggest adding another homework assignment that might vary from week to week that would come at the self-presence-ing from another angle, to complement and add depth to this very important foundation
- Students in our class continued to hold back, all the way to the end of the term. The instructor sort of asked students if they were ready to participate, rather than expressing the expectation that this was a participatory class and creating a safe environment that evoked a strong motivation to jump in.
- Another aspect of this was experienced in the frame students asked questions to the instructor and the

instructor had all the answers. An invitation for students to explore the questions together and find their way to a variety of answers through guidance, might cultivate an ambiance in which it is safe to inhabit our own wisdom, and build confidence in the process, rather than reinforcing that the instructor had all their answers. That said, I know that it is a fine line for an instructor with only a limited time to guide student explorations. And truly, LaShelle's compassion was always a guiding light, no matter what."

- I hate zoom, but everything else was great.
- LaShelle did a great job of adjusting this course to Zoom, but there is a limit to what can be experienced in giving empathy online. This was no fault of her teaching; it is just that the course itself isn't as conducive as other courses might be to being carried out online. I would not recommend having courses like this offered online unless, as now, there is no other choice. One of the reasons is just not knowing some of the students very well and being asked to be deeply personal about experiences each week.
- The course was great. I learned so much about myself and how to better to be of service to others. Lashelle has got it down all the way through. Zoom perfection.
- The live coaching in front of people was both scary and great. My suggestion is that we do it closer to the beginning rather than the end. I felt a got a better sense how to do it but then the class is over. Maybe not at absolute start but closer to the start. Maybe starting class 4 or something like that.
- I found myself drawing from what I learned in this course all the time. Learning to attune yourself to others' needs and feelings, I feel, is a crucial part of ending suffering. LaShelle is a wonderful teacher, and I'm really looking forward to more of her classes.
- This was my favorite class! The practical expression of practicing empathy, learning what is not empathy, and so
  much more is totally applicable to real life- whether it be chaplaincy, or any ways we serve sentient beings. Thank
  you for offering this very practical class. This class worked. I can think of no critical feedback.
- This class worked well on Zoom, especially with breakout rooms. I think we developed a strong sense of
  connection with LaChelle and with our classmates. The feelings and needs cards were sometimes difficult
  because some of us had very little contact (and hence very few substantive conversations) with others. Although
  conversations with yourself were accepted, they became rather artificial after a while.
- "I would have really loved the readings to have been better integrated into the course. They were all put in at the first five weeks (frontloaded), which was difficult because we never had enough time to fully explore or talk about them. They were packed full of useful information that was not really discussed or delved into.
- I would have also loved to have more taught content and a little less time on the pair work, which sometimes took up 90% of the class. Although LaShelle probably had the class planned that way for a reason, I wanted to hear more from LaShelle about the content we were learning. She is an incredible teacher and I wanted more of that.
- Some kind of occasional, even informal, quizzes might have been helpful so that we could track what we were
  learning as we went along. I didn't realize what I'd learned specifically until we did the post-assessment, which
  was really great but came at the very end.
- The online discussions were all good and helpful, but I would have really loved some time for in-class discussions around what we were learning each week. That could be done in break-out rooms, so that we could better integrate and share what we were learning. They could be free-form rather than scripted exercises, which would give us time to share and connect with the material and with each other more naturally.
- Although some students found the ""final empathy exam"" stressful because it was in front of everyone, I actually found it incredibly educational and kind of a highlight of the whole course, because it gave me the opportunity to witness ""live"" demonstrations of what we were practicing, with both the chat from students watching (which was super helpful) and LaShelle's comments (even more helpful). Especially hearing LaShelle's finely-tuned feedback of everyone's ""performance"" was beyond beneficial, in terms of what I learned from it."
- I am always happy to learn from LaShelle.
- This was an outstanding class! Didn't miss a beat.
- I would like everyone to get at least one chance to pair with each other in the breakout rooms.

- "LaShelle is a kind and generous teacher, and a master in this field. She inspires her students to learn, practice and grow.
- One thing that seemed inappropriate as well as frustrating to me was when she would send us to her website for further information. In my years of being a student I never had an instructor direct me to their website unless I was on a webinar, which is set up to hook people by giving free information and then capture leads for their business. Therefore I had the impression that she was promoting her business and SEO; it felt unprofessional within the context of a college education. I am 99% certain that was not her intention.
- There were no readings assigned for this class beyond her handouts, which she told us were from the book she was writing, and some of the handout pages did not feel fleshed out. Directions given in class were often not clear, and the instruction in the pages was also not always clear. I would encourage LaShelle to prepare proper lesson plans and maybe offer some outside readings to flesh things out. Hearing from different experts who explain things differently supports the variety of ways that students learn. It would only strengthen the curriculum that she delivers so expertly.
- The exercises LaShelle gave us in class were wonderful, providing ample space for students to discover conditioning and begin to access pure presence for the purpose of cultivating connection with self and others.
- My key takeaway from this class is the invitation to give empathy without expectation, for the purpose of enhancing connection. Many students in our class, myself included, have in the past used empathy as a method for helping ourselves feel better about ourselves, and to possibly bring an outcome in others' behavior. This is misdirected and perpetuates suffering. As LaShelle so beautifully demonstrated from beginning to end, empathy is a way we can focalize and share our love with the world, for the benefit of all."



  and effort.



- I only put neither because I would only recommend this class to a person who wishes to dive deep into translation studies and already has a strong foundation in Tibetan and Tibetan grammar.
- I think once we got going and figured out the flow of this class, then it worked really well. I think we have our cadence now and like how it is going.
- "I really enjoyed working on the shared Google doc. It allowed us to work privately on our own time but also come together and struggle as a team over the tricky bits. The doc sends emails when someone posts a comment/question and we can reply to it.
- It was great that people were able to come to study group twice a week for at least an hour both days to present our problems to each other (and often to Bill).
- Populi continues to be super useful.
- It's priceless getting to work with Rinpoche.

- It would be nice to get more students enrolled who might be able to add to the doctrinal component of understanding the text. We have some strong grammar skills, but are often totally dependent on Rinpoche for doctrine and we just don't always have enough time to ask everything we'd like.
- Letting us determine our own pace was nice. We pushed ourselves really hard, so having the faith shown in us seemed to pay off.
- The experience of trying to agree as a committee was interesting: It was all positive to get help, but not always all positive to have to agree on something in the end, even though the differences were never major. Having both the support of the group but also the freedom for individuality was pretty Goldilocks.
- The text helped me understand doctrine and was useful for life. The grammar issues were super useful and having to put the ""clause salad"" together on our own was an enjoyable challenge. This would have been almost impossible without Bill's visits to our study group. Rinpoche's commentary is not enough for us to understand the grammar. This class should always have at least one grammarian on the team in my opinion. We had three and a half (MJ kills it on English grammar), so it was good."
- "It was helpful to have a shared Google Doc between the students with all of the weekly translation updates.
- I found it was useful to be able to see how my classmates interpreted the grammar, definitions, and put each sentence together.
- I also like the pedagogy style of the class. First Rinpoche would look over the students translation and then He would explain the meaning from his understanding of the Tibetan language and the Dharma teachings. It was great to have him look over the students work for the week and then give feedback based on what was finished. That feedback added value to the student translation and provided a deeper meaning to the content which propelled more questions from the students and then Rinpoche answered accordingly. This style felt very engaged."
